How to Enter Artwork

Any student who wishes to enter artwork in the 2016 Congressional Art Contest should deliver or mail their artwork to Rep. Trott's Troy Office.

If you are delivering artwork in person, the office is open between the hours of 9:00am and 5:00pm Monday – Friday.

All submitted artwork must abide by the contest guidelines (see next page) and entries must be submitted with the following:

- Student's name
- Student's address
- Phone number
- School name
- Art teacher's name

If students are mailing their artwork, it is highly recommended that student's purchase mailing insurance on any packages they send. Rep. Trott's office is not responsible for any artwork that is lost or damaged when being mailed.

Following the conclusion of the contest, each student's artwork will be mailed back to the student at the address provided in the submission.

All artwork must be submitted (postmarked) by FRIDAY, March 25, 2016

Contest Guidelines

The 2016 Congressional Art Competition is open to high school students only. Exceptions may be made for schools that have 7th through 12th grades on one campus.

Artwork must be two-dimensional.

Each framed artwork can be no larger than 28" x 28" x 4" (28 inches high, 28 inches wide, and 4 inches deep).

Accepted mediums for the two-dimensional artwork are as follows:

- Paintings: oil, acrylics, watercolor, etc.
- Drawings: colored pencil, pencil, ink, marker, pastels, charcoal (It is recommended that charcoal and pastel drawings be fixed.)
- Collages: must be two dimensional
- Prints: lithographs, silkscreen, block prints
- Mixed Media: use of more than two mediums such as pencil, ink, watercolor, etc
- Computer-generated art
- Photographs

The student art which is selected as the winner will be required to be framed and must still measure no larger than the above maximum dimensions. No framed piece should weigh more than 15 pounds.

Each entry must be original in concept, design, and execution and may not violate U.S. copyright laws. Any entry that has been copied from an existing photo or image (including a painting, graphic, or advertisement) that was created by someone other than the student is a violation of the competition rules and will not be accepted.

Artwork will hang in the Capitol for the entire year of the exhibition and cannot be returned to the students earlier. Students should, therefore, submit artwork they will not need for other purposes.

Suitability Guidelines & Student Information

Suitability Guidelines

As outlined in these guidelines, the final decision regarding the suitability of all artwork for the 2016 Congressional Art Competition exhibition in the Capitol will be made by a panel of qualified persons chaired by the Architect of the Capitol. While it is not the intent to censor any artwork, we do wish to avoid artwork that is potentially inappropriate for display in this highly travelled area leading to the Capitol. Artwork must adhere to the policy of the House Office Building Commission. In accordance with this policy, exhibits depicting subjects of contemporary political controversy or a sensationalistic or gruesome nature are not allowed. It is necessary that all artwork be reviewed by the panel chaired by the Architect of the Capitol and any portion not in consonance with the Commission's policy will be omitted from the exhibit.

Winning Student Information and Release Form (a copy of the form is at the end of this packet)

The winning student must submit a Student Information and Release Form. The Student Information and Release Form are available at the end of this packet. The information requested on the first page of the form should be provided as thoroughly as possible. Students should list their mailing addresses, if they differ from their home addresses. The form requires a description of the artwork, which should be detailed, clearly identifying the major elements of the work. For example, "self-portrait" or "a picture of two people" would be unacceptable, due to the large number of works that would fit that description.

The following is an example of an acceptable description: "A painting of two people; the one on the left wears a green sweater and khaki pants; the one on the right wears a black shirt and a striped skirt. A dog sits at their feet."

The second page of the Student Information and Release Form contains a legal release and a certification that the artwork is original in design and execution. The student, an art teacher, and a parent or guardian must sign where appropriate.

A **TYPED** copy of the Student Information and Release Form, signed by the teacher, a parent or guardian, and the student, **must be** securely attached to the back of the artwork to certify the originality of the piece. Please retain a copy for your records.

Judging Process

All artwork must be submitted by **FRIDAY, MARCH 25, 2016**

Rep. Trott has assembled a panel of local art judges who will select the winner of the 2016 Congressional Art Competition in Michigan's 11th District.

The panel of judges will be comprised of residents who have recognized art credentials and are part of the arts community in Southeast Michigan.

Following the submission deadline, the judging panel will review the entries. Each entry will be able to be awarded up to five points from each judge. The entry with the overall highest score shall be named the winning entry.

The student winner will be notified in the early part of May 2016.

Helpful Hints for Your Art Entry

- Remember, your artwork can be no larger than 28" x 28" x 4" (28inches high, 28 inches wide, and 4 inches deep).
- Artwork must be two-dimensional.
- Your entry must be your own design and creation. Be original.
- Remember, the first impression a judge has of your entry is a lasting one.
- Most important—have fun and good luck!
